The Role of the Adrian District Library Board of Trustees

The Library Board is responsible for:

- Controlling the expenditure of all monies collected to the credit of the Library Fund (millage)
- Establishing and approving an annual budget.
- Supervision, care, and custody of any grounds, rooms, or buildings constructed, leased or set apart for library services.
- Developing and implementing policies that govern library service.
- Working with library administration in planning and goal setting for the library.
- Appointing a suitable Library Director and fixing his/her compensation; the Board has the power to remove such an appointee.
- Advocating for the library in the community.
- Attending and participating in all board meetings.
- Being informed about all phases of the library's operation.

Qualifications:

- Must be at least 18 years of age and reside within the City of Adrian.
- Possess a true sense of the library's importance to the economic, social and educational life of the community.
- Have an appreciation for the library and a desire to provide the best possible services for the community.

Accountable to:

The taxpayers and the people served by the Adrian District Library.

The Adrian District Library meets monthly on the third Tuesday of the month at 6 p.m. in the Community Room on the lower level of the library. The Board does not generally meet in July or December.
